Bridgeport Ranger District

Bootleg Campground

Located 22 miles north of Bridgeport on Highway 395 in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 63 single camping units
- 4 four-unit, concrete-block flush vault toilet buildings
- entry stations with 3 fee tubes and kiosks
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for campground manager, site #13
- host site with water and sewer
- Water is provided by a spring system 1/4 mile west of campground
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 2nd week in May - 3rd week of September
- Not on the reservation system

Buckeye Campground

Located 6 miles west of Bridgeport on Twin Lakes Road, then 3 miles north on Forest Road 017 in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 65 single camping units
- 1 double-unit, concrete-block vault toilet building
- 2 double CXT vault toilets and 1 single CXT vault toilet
- entry stations with 4 fee tubes and kiosks
- (2) 2,000 gallon septic tanks that drain into an evaporative sewer lagoon
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #60
- 1 host site with water and sewer
- Water provided by gravity-fed spring system with 2,500 feet of distribution line
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 1st week in May - 2nd week in October
- Not on reservation system

Chris Flat Campground

Located 20 miles north of Bridgeport on Highway 395 in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 15 single camping units
- 3 single CXT vault toilets
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for campground manager #10
- Water provided by a well system and storage tank
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: week before trout fishing season opens - end of fishing season- Last week in April – Beginning of October
- Not on reservation system
- Toilet building remains open during the winter for highway traffic

Crags Campground

Located 12 miles west of Bridgeport on Twin Lakes Road in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 48 single camping units
- 6 double camping units
- 3 triple camping units
- 1 four-unit, concrete-block flush vault toilet building
- 1 double-unit, concrete-block vault toilet building
- 2 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 2-2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground host, site #1 and site #20
- 2 host site with water and sewer
- Group site capacity 45 PAOT- Minimum operating season, 3rd week of April-2nd week of September
- Water provided by a general well system in the drainage
- Garbage service

- Minimum operating season-Last week of April-Last week of October-Sawtooth Loop
- Minimum operating season-last week of April –First week of September-Matterhorn Loop
- Reservation Sites: 3, 5-6, 8-11, 13-20, 22-24, 26,27

Green Creek Campground

Located 4 miles south of Bridgeport on Highway 395, then west 7 miles on Forest Service Road 142 (Green Creek Road)

Facilities include:

- 11 single camping units
- 2 double-unit CXT vault toilets
- 1 host site with sewer/water
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for campground manager, site #2
- Water provided by a spring fed, gravity system with 5,000 feet of distribution line
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 3rd week in May – 2nd week in September
- Not on reservation system

Green Creek Group Sites

Located 1/4 mile east of Green Creek Campground in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 2 group camping units (25/50 PAOT)
- Single-unit, concrete-block vault toilet building
- 10 wood tables
- Water provided by spring fed, gravity system that ties into the Green Creek Campground system
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 3rd week in May –1st week in October
- Reservation period week before Memorial Day - week after Labor Day

Honeymoon Flat Campground

*Renovations expected to be completed in 2011.
Located 8 miles west of Bridgeport Twin Lakes Road (County RD 3420)

Facilities include:

- 28 total camping units
- 22 single camping units
- 6 doubles
- 1 host site with water/sewer
- 2 entry stations with fee tubes and kiosks
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager site H1
- 2 double CXT toilets and 1 single CXT toilet vault
- Water provided by a general well system in the drainage
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 3rd week of April-3rd of October
- Reservation period (week before Memorial Day - week after Labor Day)
Reservation Sites: 1-13

Leavitt Meadows Campground

Located 7 miles west on HWY 108 (17 miles north of Bridgeport on HWY 395) in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 16 single camping units
- 1 double-unit CXT vault toilet
- 1 single-unit CXT vault toilet
- 1 host site with water/sewer
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #1
- Water provided by a spring
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 3rd week of April-2nd week in October
- Not on reservation system

Lower Twin Lake Campground

Located 12 miles west of Bridgeport on the Twin Lakes Road in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 15 single camping units

 - 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
 - 1 host site with water/sewer
 - 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #1
 - Water provided by a general well system in the drainage

 - Reservation period: week before Memorial Day - week after Labor Day
 - Reservation Sites: 2-15
- 1 host site with water/sewer
 - 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
 - 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #22
 - Water is provided by a general well system in the drainage
 - Garbage service
 - Minimum operating season: 2nd week of May – 3rd week of September
 - Reservation period: week before Memorial Day - week after Labor Day
 - Reservation Sites: 1, 3-21

Obsidian Campground

Located 16 miles north of Bridgeport on Hwy 395, then 3.5 miles east on Little Walker River Road in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 14 single camping units
- 3 single vault CXT vault toilets
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- No water
- Pack in/Pack out garbage
- Minimum operating season: last week of May - Last week of September
- Currently has no host
- Not on reservation system

Paha Campground

Located 10 miles west of Bridgeport on Twin Lakes Road in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 22 single camping units
- 1 four-unit, concrete-block mini-flush vault toilet building

Robinson Creek North Campground

Located 9 miles west of Bridgeport on Twin

Sonora Bridge Campground

- 1 double CXT vault toilet
- 1 host site with water/sewer
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #18
- Water is sent from a well with an electric pump to a pressurized tank
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 2nd week of May – Last week of September

Trumbull Lake Campground

Located 12 miles south of Bridgeport on
Hwy 395, then west 6 miles on Virginia
Lakes Road in Mono County, California

Facilities include:

- 45 single camping units
- 3 double unit CXT vault toilets
- 2 single unit CXT vault toilets
- 1 well fed, gravity water system with 3,000 linear feet of distribution line
- 2,000 gallon septic vault for a campground manager, site #1
- 1 entry station with fee tube and kiosk
- 1 host site with sewer, water
- Water supplied by well-fed gravity system with 3,000 feet of distribution line
- Garbage service
- Minimum operating season: 3rd week of June - 2nd week in October
- Reservation Sites: 1-18, 38-43




Chris Flat Campground




Crags Campground (Sawtooth Loop)




Crags Campground Matterhorn Loop






**HONEYMOON FLAT CAMPGROUND
UPPER SITE**





LOWER SITE**










