Applicable Forest Order

UNITED STATES DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
FOREST SERVICE

HUMBOLDT-TOIYABE NATIONAL FOREST

OCCUPANCY AND USE RESTRICTIONS
14 Day Stay Limit

A. PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area, roads, and trails as described in this order, within the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest until further notice.

1. **Camping or possessing camping equipment in excess of fourteen (14) days in any thirty (30) day consecutive period. [36 CFR 261.58(a)]**

B. EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following persons and area is exempt from this order.

1. Bootleg Campground on the Bridgeport Ranger District. Stay Limit is thirty (30) days in any ninety (90) day consecutive period.
2. Persons with a permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
3. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of a organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

C. AREA DESCRIBED

All National Forest System lands within the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest, except for the Bootleg Campground on the Bridgeport Ranger District. (See Exemptions).

D. PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is for the protection of natural resources and the enhancement of recreational opportunities for all National Forest System users.

E. IMPLEMENTATION

1. Exhibit A, Map and Exhibit B, Definitions are attached and incorporated as part of this ORDER.
2. This Special Order implementing Occupancy and Use Restrictions is effective at 12:01 A.M. on April 1, 2009, and shall remain in effect until rescinded.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable as a class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization and/or imprisonment of not more than 6 months [Title 16 USC 551, 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].




EXHIBIT B

DEFINITIONS

**OCCUPANCY AND USE
14 Day Stay Limit**

CAMPING: means the temporary use of National Forest System lands for the purpose of overnight occupancy without a permanently-fixed structure.

(This includes Developed Recreation Sites; Campgrounds, and any Dispersed Camping)

CAMPING EQUIPMENT: means the personal property used in or suitable for camping, and includes any vehicle used for transportation and all equipment in possession of a person camping. Food and beverage are not considered camping equipment.

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM: includes all national forest lands, and waters reserved or withdrawn from the public domain of the United States, national forest lands and waters acquired through purchase, exchange, donation, or other means, national grasslands and land utilization projects and waters administered under title III of the Bankhead-Jones Farm Tenant ACT (50 Stat. 525, 7 U.S.C. 1010-1012), and other lands, waters, or interests therein acquired under the Wild and Scenic River Act (16 U.S.C. 1272-1287) or National Trails Systems Act (16 U.S.C. 1241-1249).

For further definitions or clarification of definitions, refer to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.2.
