

Invasive Plant Species

Invasive species may be defined as those that have been introduced into an environment in which they did not evolve and thus have no natural enemies to limit their reproduction and spread. Invasive species typically have high reproductive rates, fast growth rates, and good dispersal mechanisms. This map shows the areas where specific invasive plant species are found on the Grasslands and will be updated as new infestations are discovered.

Invasive plant occurrences were delineated by Grasslands district staff in 2005.
