<p>We recommend this species be considered for local emphasis – very few threats except for the occasional rock climber; 45 occurrences with around 40,000 individuals located on Forest Service lands; habitat located on seepy calcareous outcrops and cliffs along streams. This reviewer is familiar with this species and its habitat and knows it from fairly inaccessible seepy granitic and calcareous cliffs. Endemic to CO and an S3 in CO.</p>
