Recommendation Rationale					
<p>This cinquefoil is known from WY, CO and NM. It is also found in R4 (Bridger-Teton). 7 element occurrences have been documented in WY from the Shoshone NF. In CO, 45 element occurrences are found within six NF. Its habitat is gravelly ridges and slopes, upper subalpine and alpine. In WY, its elevational range is 8,500 to 10,300 feet. Its habitat is locally extensive but its range is very limited. In CO, some of the populations are large, numbering in the several thousands. The plants are suspected to have a high reproductive rate due to the incidence of pseudogamy and apomixis.</p>
