Eldorado National Forest
Bald Eagle Granlee's Point Closure Area

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a), and to protect nesting bald eagles, the following act is prohibited in the Granlee's Point Closure Area on the Pacific Ranger District of the Eldorado National Forest. This Order is effective from January 4, 2011 through August 15, 2011, and from January 2, 2012 through August 15, 2012.

Going into or being upon the Granlee's Point Closure Area. The boundary of the Granlee's Point Closure Point Area begins at an unnamed stream that intersects the shoreline of the Union Valley Reservoir in the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section 22, Township 12 North, Range 14 East, Mt. Diablo Base and Meridian (MDB&M); then continues northwest along the shoreline to its intersection with an unnamed stream in the northeast quarter of the northwest quarter of Section 23, Township 12 North, Range 14 East, MDB&M; then continues south to its intersection with the boundary of the Eldorado National Forest; then continues southwest along the boundary of the Eldorado National Forest to its intersection with the Union Valley Bike Trail; then continues northwest along the unnamed stream back to the starting point, as shown on Exhibit 1. 36 CFR 261.53(a).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- (1) Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
36 CFR 261.50(e)(4).
- (2) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission. 36 CFR 261.50(e)(1).

This prohibition is in addition to the General Prohibitions found in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571 and 3581.
