Help guide visitors to the Pack Creek Zoological Area

The Forest Service is offering guiding opportunities at the Pack Creek Zoological Area (PCZA) on Admiralty Island National Monument. This popular bear-viewing area in the heart of the Kootznoowoo Wilderness 28 miles south of Juneau includes Pack Creek, Windfall Harbor, Swan Cove and nearby islands. Management direction has recently been updated, and guides are invited to submit bids under prospectus.

What's the prospectus?

The prospectus is being issued to solicit applications in a competitive process for nature-based viewing outfitting and guiding permits at the PCZA. Permits will be awarded based on the evaluation criteria and other required documentation as described in the prospectus to preferred operators who have demonstrated ability to provide high-quality public services. Applications are due on June 24, 2011.

The permit will be issued for a term of two years beginning June 1, 2012, with the option for an additional eight-year term until May 21, 2021. The prospectus is now available for viewing on the Tongass National Forest's website at <http://www.fs.fed.us/r10/tongass/PackCreek-OG/PackCreek.shtml>.
