ACCESSIBLE AREAS FOR PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES: ♿

Oaks Picnic Area: Day Use only.

West Fork Road: Access is available by permit at the San Gabriel River Ranger District located in Glendora. Glenn Camp has three sites available for disabled.

ROADS:

Highway 39: Open to Crystal Lake Road junction (mm 38.13).

East Fork Road: Open

Mt. Baldy Road: Open. (Chains may be required during/after a winter storm.)

Glendora Ridge Road: Open

Glendora Mtn Road: Open

Crystal Lake Road: Open (Chains may be required during/after a winter storm.)

OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLE AREAS & ROUTES:

Registration and Forest Service approved spark arrestors are required. ATV and dirt bike riders must wear a helmet. ATV riders under age 18 must complete a safety course. All vehicles must meet local, State and Federal laws.

No Alcoholic beverages are allowed.

Areas may be closed at any time due to unsafe conditions caused by storms, fire danger or excessive use capacity.

San Gabriel Canyon OHV Area: Saturday/Sunday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. All vehicles must exit the area by 5 p.m.

FEES: \$8 for the Primary vehicle and \$5 for each additional vehicle.

Rincon-Shortcut OHV Route: Open for hike-in and mountain bicycles. Permits not required. Closed to motor vehicles at this time due to road conditions.

SAN GABRIEL RIVER RANGER DISTRICT (SGRRD) continued:

CAMPGROUNDS:

Manker Flats Campground: Opens May 15.

First-come/First-serve. **\$14** per site/per night for one car. \$5.00 for second vehicle. 21 sites available. RV length varies between 16-22 feet. Running water and flush toilets are available. Open fire in the fire pit provided. (Bring your own wood). Charcoal in the grill provided. Propane and pressurized gas stoves allowed.

Glenn Trail Camp: Open. First-come/first-serve. Ten sites available. Three sites are handicap accessible. Access is hike-in or bicycles. Vehicle access with permit for disabled. Pit toilets and stream water available. Open fire in the fire pit provided. Charcoal in the grill provided. Propane or pressurized gas camp stoves allowed. ***Campfire permit is required.***

Coldbrook Campground: Open. First come/First Serve. \$12 per site for one vehicle. \$5 for second vehicle. ***No drinkable water.*** Pit toilets. Stream water available...must be treated before drinking. Open fire in the fire pit provided (Must have water/soil at the fire pit). Propane and pressurized gas stoves allowed.

Crystal Lake Campground: Open 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Day Use Only. ***NO*** Overnight camping. Cost is \$5. An Adventure Pass or Interagency Passport is required. Crystal Lake Store (Closed Monday) sells the Daily AP.

RIVERS and STREAMS: All rivers and streams are running high and fast. Extreme care should be taken.

FISHING:

A valid California fishing license is required. For **stocking information**, contact the California State Fish and Game Department at (562) 594-7268.

West Fork: *Only artificial flies or lures with a single barbless hook may be used in the West Fork and its tributaries. From the second crossing up it is "Catch and Release" only.*

East Fork: Open

North Fork: Open.

San Gabriel Dam: North shoreline only.

San Antonio River: Open

TARGET SHOOTING:

Burro Canyon Shooting Park: Thursday through Monday, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. For further information call (626) 910-1344.

PICNIC AREAS:

The Oaks: 14 group picnic sites for **Day-Use Only**. Restrooms are available. Charcoal allowed in the grills provided. **No wood fires.** Self-contained Bar-B-Q's, propane and pressurized gas camp stoves are allowed. An Adventure Pass or Interagency Passport is required.

SAN GABRIEL RIVER RANGER DISTRICT (SGRRD) continued:

HIKING TRAILS:

GENERAL INFORMATION: For safety reasons, hiking trails are **not** recommended for equestrian or bicycle travel.

All high elevation peaks are under snow and may require snowshoes/crampons to reach the summit. Trails to high elevation peaks may also have snow/ice.

Mt. Baldy trails and peak: Open

Icehouse Canyon: Open

Bridge to Nowhere: Open. Water is extremely deep (up to 6 feet) and running fast.

West Fork and Bear Creek trail: Upper Bear Creek Trail is open to creek (5.5 miles one-way). Lower Bear Creek Trail (off the West Fork) water is too high to access safely.
