**Grazing Restrictions:**

No current grazing restrictions apply to this allotment.

**Allowable Use:**

The 1999 Environmental Assessment and Decision Notice identified 35% as the maximum allowable utilization by grazing animals.

**Utilization Monitoring:**

Utilization monitoring will be conducted on or near key areas of your allotment. District personnel will monitor pasture use, and determine utilization percentage at that time. Monitoring dates will be set according to the previous year's monitoring results. If pastures were approaching allowable use during the 2010 grazing season they will be monitored at the mid-point of the pasture use period to determine if it is necessary for livestock to be moved to the next pasture in the rotation. Please note the following approximate dates that are scheduled for monitoring on the Gallo Mountain Allotment. You are encouraged to participate in monitoring utilization levels.

**2011 Monitoring Dates:**

If any one key area in a pasture being grazed by livestock exceeds utilization on the uplands or heavily hedging of woody riparian plant sprouts/seedlings, livestock will be moved to another area of the pasture where actual use is less than allowable use. If all remaining key areas in the grazed pasture are at allowable use, livestock will be required to be moved early to the next scheduled pasture. This requirement is necessary to prevent overuse on forage plants.

**Forage Growth and Water Availability:**

If forage growth and water availability are not adequate during all or portions of the 2011 grazing season, total or partial removal of livestock from the allotment may be necessary. Part 2, clause 8(c) of the grazing permit provides this option.

**Actual Use:**

Actual use for the 2010 grazing season was calculated at 2,699 AM's on the forest permit and 86 AM's on the private permit. The total AM's for the Gallo Mountain Allotment for the 2009 grazing season equaled 2,785 AM's.

**Range Developments:**

All assigned range developments identified in the Term Grazing Permit will be maintained to a functional status.
