EMERGENCY PROHIBITIONS

FOREST SUPERVISOR ORDER NO. 08-13-01-11-02 FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to 36 C.F.R. Part 261, Subpart B, the following acts are prohibited on the Angelina National Forest located in Angelina, Jasper, San Augustine and Nacogdoches Counties, Texas. The areas affected by this order are shown on the attached map. This order will be in effect beginning April 15, 2011 until July 15, 2011, or until rescinded.

- 1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire or charcoal fire is prohibited throughout the above-named national forest. 36 CFR 261.52(a)**
- 2. Smoking is prohibited throughout the above-named national forest. 36 CFR 261.52(d)**
- 3. Violating any state or county law concerning burning or fires, which are for the purpose of preventing, or restricting the spread of fires is prohibited throughout the above-named national forest. 36 CFR 261.52(k)**

Exceptions to these Prohibitions:

- a. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire or charcoal fire is permitted within developed recreation areas Sandy Creek, Boykin Springs, Bouton Lake, Caney Creek and Townsend only, using the existing permanently mounted fire rings and permanently mounted grills.**
- b. Smoking is allowed only within an enclosed vehicle or building, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.**

Pursuant to 36 CFR § 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

- a. Any Federal, State, or Local Law Enforcement Officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.**

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).
