


Huron-Manistee National Forests

AuSable River Shoreline Erosion Stabilization

The Huron Manistee National Forests plan to conduct restoration activities on National Forest system lands adjacent to the AuSable River and primitive campsites and developed day use sites established along these shorelines.

Public use at campsites and other recreation day use areas has resulted in shoreline erosion. Stabilization projects will slow the erosion and stabilize use areas. Stabilization will include sand fill, rustic steps or waterbars, topsoil, and will be seeded to native grasses and mulch.

This project potentially covers developed use sites along this entire AuSable River corridor, but initial work will begin along Cooke Dam Road and is described as spots in Section 14, 20 and 21 of T24N R7E, Iosco County, Michigan Meridian.
