About the Trail

Burdette Creek Trail #2 is a dead-end trail that provides access into the Burdette Creek drainage. The major period of use is during the hunting season. The trail follows the creek for the majority of its length and gains only 400 feet elevation within 5 miles.

Accessing the Trail

Access from the North: 38 miles west of Missoula on I-90, take the Fish Creek exit 66. Follow Fish Creek Rd. 343 south, 20 miles to Burdette Creek Trail 2, northeast of Road 343.

Access from the South: Follow Lewis & Clark Highway 12, 27 miles west of Lolo to Fish Creek Rd. 343. Turn north and drive 9 miles to Burdette Creek Trail 2, northeast side of Road 343.

Parking & Camping

Access is located on a wide out on the main Fish Creek Road. No trailhead facilities. Parking is limited to three or four vehicles. Several dispersed camping and picnicking sites are available along the trail.

Stock Facilities

No facilities for stock. Please be careful when loading and unloading stock from the trailers as space is limited. Supplemental feed should be carried on extended trips longer than one day. Certified weed free feed is required.
