Johnson's Hunting Ground: **Snow Covered**

Kelly Lake: **Open**

Kelsey Trail: **Open from Elbow Springs. Is good to Bear Lake Junction. Trail is under snow to the lakes in Siskiyou Wilderness. Kelsey to Red Hill Junction is covered with brush and rocks, not recommended for livestock.**

No Mans: **Open**, may encounter snow at high elevations

North Fork and Mule Bridge: open

Paradise: Accessible via Canyon Creek on Roads 41 and 44. No snow at trail head, but snow on trail. Water crossing is high, but do-able.

Ridgeline: Fully open, but use extreme driving skills reaching trailhead.

Shackelford: open to trailhead, road is rough, Log Lake is open

Road Report

Mt Ashland

Road 22: Open and snow free the entire distance

Road 20 at Long John Saddle (20/22): Snow free ½ mile to the east and ¼ mile to the west, then big drifts

Road 20 at Mt Ashland: Road is snow free for 1 mile to the 300 Jct. Very large drifts beyond this point. 50/50 chance of getting to Grouse Gap by July 10. Very large drifts in the shady areas.

2080: Open, but some snow remains

Pacific Crest Trail: Snow is melting, should be accessible by mid July. Trail between Mt Ashland and Grouse Gap is now 90% snow free.

Modoc- National Forest

Update 6-28-2011: Medicine Lake will not be open for the 4th of July due to an excessive amount of snow.
