



## **Addendum to Premium Explorations 2010 Chrome Mountain – Gallatin Plan of Operations**

Dear Sirs,

This letter serves as an addendum to the 2010 Chrome Mountain – Gallatin 2010 Plan of Operations for exploratory mineral drilling submitted by Premium Exploration Inc. This Plan of Operations was submitted to the Forest Service on 6/15/2010. Premium recently became aware of the 5/28/2010 re-delegation of authority to the Department of Agriculture's Under Secretary for Natural Resources and Environment to approve "incidental timber cutting within inventoried roadless areas that is associated with operations of locatable mining activities." Forest Service representatives have indicated that Under Secretary approval for operations with incidental timber cutting in inventoried roadless areas could take 6 months to 1 year. Due to this approval delay, Premium Exploration is amending this Plan of Operations for activities in inventoried roadless areas on National Forest lands. In regards to the designated roadless areas Premium Exploration has not proposed reconstructing roads or constructing any new roads in inventoried roadless areas or elsewhere. Premium Exploration will defer operations in inventoried roadless areas involving incidental tree cutting until approved by the Under Secretary. Until such approval occurs, drill-sites and access routes in inventoried roadless areas will be located in open un-timbered areas and incidental tree cutting will not be performed. Drill locations in inventoried roadless areas where tree cutting is needed for access, safety, or to accommodate drilling equipment will be deferred until Premium Exploration receives necessary approval from the Under Secretary. This may defer some operations in portions of the inventoried roadless area until 2011.
