Logan Creek Bridge at Tally Lake Campground to be Replaced
Changes in Access to Pavilion, Group Site and Four Campsites

Work is scheduled to begin on Monday, July 18 to replace the bridge across Logan Creek in the Tally Lake Campground on the Tally Lake Ranger District, west of Whitefish. The bridge may be closed for up to six weeks.

The bridge is used to access the pavilion, group camp site and four individual campsites located on the north shore of Tally Lake. During construction, access to the pavilion is available by parking in the day-use area and walking across the foot bridge. Access to the pavilion, and the group camp site and four individual sites can be accessed by using Forest Road #2895 from the Star Meadow Road. This access road is a very narrow single-lane road and is not suitable for trailers or other large vehicles. Access to the remaining 36 campsites, the boat launch and day-use area will not be affected by this work.

The group campsite and pavilion require reservations available through www.recreation.gov or by calling 1-877-444-6777. The 40 individual campsites are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Tally Lake Ranger District Recreation Specialist Hans Castren asks the public to be patient during this construction. He stresses that you should use extreme caution if you chose to use Forest Road #2895 to access the north shore of Tally Lake. Once the bridge replacement is complete, the new bridge will be wider and safer than the original structure.

The bridge replacement is funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act. For more information about this temporary access change and closure, contact the Tally Lake Ranger District at 758-5204.
