This AOI is made part of your grazing permit consistent with Part 1, item 3 and Part 2, Item 8(a). Situations may develop during the grazing season which requires changes to these instructions. If this becomes necessary, or if you cannot comply with some or part of these instructions, contact the District Ranger and obtain approval before initiating changes or deviating from these instructions. Failure to follow these instructions is a violation of your permit.

Please be aware that nonuse in excess of 10% of your permitted numbers must be requested at least 30 days before the “on” date. Nonuse for personal convenience may be approved on a year-to-year basis for a maximum of three consecutive years and not more than four years in any 10-year period. Longer periods of nonuse for range protection will only be approved under a written agreement.

\*The above schedule is an **estimate** and may be modified at any time if: utilization levels are met, water availability is inadequate, drought, delayed forage development or wet soil conditions.

If allowable use levels are met early in the scheduled pasture, cattle will be moved to another pasture, or removed from the Forest.

Type of rotation: Deferred rotation

Cattle should be kept in the proper pasture at all times, when proper use is met in the current pasture All cattle should be removed and not be allowed to return for the remainder of the season.

All livestock must be removed from the Forest by the permitted off date listed above. This means if it takes you 10 days to gather your cattle you should begin on Sept 20.

Additional instructions: Grazing will begin when perennial grasses reach the flower head stage in both the North and South Divisions.

**UTILIZATION STANDARDS & MONITORING**

**Maximum Allowable Forage Use Criteria**

Vegetation Type	Stubble Height/Use	Comments
Riparian Hydric Species	4"	Triggers the time to move livestock between units or off the allotment.
Riparian Emphasis Management Areas	6"	Triggers the time to move livestock between units or off the allotment.

Non-hydric sod forming grass species in riparian areas	1.5"	Primarily Kentucky bluegrass-Triggers the time to move livestock between units or off the allotment.
Wheatgrass seedings	60%	Management option to exceed 60% use to maintain healthy seedings.
Riparian/upland browse: Sprouts and young-aged plants	≤40%	# of current year's available twigs removed.
Riparian/upland mature browse	≤50%	# of current year's available twigs removed.
Upland grass/forb	40-60% of key species; varies by grazing system and desired condition	% of current year's growth.
Riparian ground cover	Maintain ground cover of at least 70% within riparian areas.	

You are responsible to monitor your livestock and comply with the listed utilization standards and to move livestock prior to any of the above standards being exceeded.

Compliance monitoring inspections will be conducted by Forest Service personnel throughout the grazing season in key areas across the allotment. You are invited, it is recommended that you participate in these inspections.

Key areas for each unit are: South Division; Big Hollow, Area along road about half way between pond next to road and cattle guard between big hollow and Burnt Hollow Units. Goat Spring, Head of East Corn Creek and bottom of Pauls Canyon.

North Division; Deer Creek, Deer Creek bottom between cattleguard and pond, Mill Canyon, Head of mill Canyon and the head of Three Forks, Cottonwood, Bottom of Cottonwood and terraces in the head of Willardson Springs.

Exceeding the utilization standards is considered non-compliance with your Term Grazing Permit and may be subject to suspension or cancellation of the permit.

### **BILLING**

Your annual grazing bill must be paid and notification received in our office prior to turning livestock onto the National Forest. It may take 10 days or more from the time you mail your payment until we receive payment notification so plan accordingly.

## **RANGE IMPROVEMENTS**

You are responsible for maintaining the range improvements assigned to you in Part 3 of your Term Grazing Permit. All improvements are to be maintained to standard prior to livestock entering a pasture, even in the event of non-use. Scheduled reconstruction for upcoming season: ¼ mile reconstruction of fence in south side. Install 2 troughs in Little Valley

All improvement must be maintained to Forest Service standards.

Any improvement, which is no longer functional or no longer needed, will be removed from the allotment by the permittee. The removal of any improvement must have prior approval by the District Ranger.

Failure to maintain your assigned range improvements may be considered as non-compliance with your Term Grazing Permit and may be subject to suspension or cancellation of your permit.

### **GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS**

You or the association will furnish sufficient riders or herders for proper distribution, protection and management of livestock on the allotment as required by the Allotment Management Plan (AMP) and/or Annual Operating Instructions (AOI). Additional herding may be necessary to have 100% compliance with the pasture rotation. Despite the additional workload it is crucial to keep cattle is scheduled pasture.

You are required to **submit actual use** information for the allotment. Please complete the enclosed form and return it to the district office within two weeks of removal of livestock from the Forest.

Salt and other dietary supplements are a distribution tool, and as such, should not be placed within ¼ mile of riparian areas, water troughs and ponds; within 200 ft. of designated roads, trails, trail heads or camping spots which have frequent use. Avoid salting in or near tree plantations or regenerating aspen stands. Exceptions to these standards must have prior approval. Salt will be removed from areas where feed has been used to standards.

The Fishlake National Forest Travel Plan must be followed while managing livestock unless approved in advance and in writing by the District Ranger.

All livestock feed or straw brought onto the Forest must be certified weed free per Regional Forester's Order #04-00-058, dated March 26, 1996

Dead livestock shall be moved at least  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile from roads, water sources, and camping spots, which have evidence of frequent use.
