Forest Order # T2011-0614-UMA-02

FIRE RESTRICTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area described in this order within the Umatilla National Forest, until further notice.

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire outside of the developed recreation sites listed in Exhibit A of this order, except for liquefied and bottled gas stoves and heaters, and except for stove fires within permanent residential structures (36 CFR 261.52(a)).
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, a developed recreation site, or while stopped in an area at least three feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material (36 CFR 261.52(d)).
3. Operating an internal combustion engine. For the purpose of this order, this restriction applies to all internal combustion engines other than motor vehicles, except for electrical generators operated under the following conditions:
 - (a.) in the center of an area at least 10 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material, or;
 - (b.) when fully contained within a pickup truck bed that is devoid of all flammable material, or;
 - (c.) when factory installed in a recreational vehicle and the generator exhaust discharge is located in the center of an area at least 10 feet in diameter that is barren or cleared of all flammable material.

Pursuant to 36 CFR, Sec. 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:



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- (1.) Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
- (2.) Any Federal, State or local law enforcement officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571)
