Clear One Stewardship Sale
Area and Road Closure Order

A. PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), the following acts are prohibited on the area, roads, and trails as described in this order, in the Carson Ranger District, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest until further notice.

It is prohibited to go into or be upon any area which is closed for the protection of:

- 1) **Public Health or Safety.**
[36 CFR 261.53(e)]
- 2) **Being on the road.**
[36 CFR 261.54(e)]
- 3) **Being on a trail.**
[36 CFR 261.55(a)]

B. EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following is exempt from this order.

1. Persons with a permit specifically exempting them from the effect of this Order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
3. Any contractor or sub-contractor engaged with the Clear One Stewardship Contract.

C. AREA DESCRIBED

Forest System Road #41084A from the locked gate near the Spooner Rest Area to the locked gate on Hwy 50. The Spooner road from the locked gate at Hwy 50 to the Genoa Peak road (road 14N32) and the area around these roads, as displayed on Exhibit A, Map. The legal description is T14N, R19E, sections 5, 6, 7 and 8, Mount Diablo Meridian.

D. PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to protect public health, well being and safety. Clear One is a stewardship contract that includes helicopter and tractor logging of sawtimber and non-merchantable material. This will include yarding trees with tops and limbs attached and also yarding small diameter material (slash) with a helicopter. Pieces may come loose from the helicopter causing the potential to injure publics within the project area.

E. IMPLEMENTATION

- 1) This Special Order implementing Area Closure Restrictions is effective at 12:00 A.M. on September 9, 2011, and shall remain in effect until rescinded.
- 2) Exhibit A - Map and Exhibit B - Definitions are attached and incorporated into this ORDER.


Violation of these prohibitions is punishable as a class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization and/or imprisonment of not more than 6 months [Title 16 USC 551, 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].


Exhibit A - Map

It is prohibited to be within the areas, roads or trails within the boundaries of the Clear One Closure

Violations Punishable

Any violation of these prohibitions is punishable as a class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization and/or imprisonment for not more than 6 months [Title 16 USC 551, 18 USC 3571 (b) (6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b) (7)].




EXHIBIT B
DEFINITIONS

AREA: Means a discrete, specifically delineated space that is smaller, and in most cases much smaller than a Ranger District.

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM ROAD: Means forest roads other than a road which has been authorized by legally documented right-of-way held by a State, county or other local public road authority.

NATIONAL FOREST SYSTEM TRAIL: Means forest trails other than a trail which has been authorized by a legally documented right-of-way held by a State, county or other local public road authority.

FOREST ROAD AND TRAIL: Means a road or trail wholly or partly within or adjacent to and serving the National Forest System that the Forest Service determines is necessary for the protection, administration, and utilization of the National Forest System and the use and development of its resources.

For further definitions or clarification of definitions, refer to Title 36 Code of Federal Regulations 261.2.
