

Angelina National Forest

The Angelina National Forest is located in Angelina, Jasper, Nacogdoches, and San Augustine Counties in east Texas. There are approximately 402,232 acres inside the proclaimed National Forest boundary of which 153,179 acres (38 percent) is National Forest land. The National Forest land within the proclaimed boundary is intermingled with private land which includes corporate and private timberland, pasture land, farms, home sites, and business.



Abstract: Roads analysis is an integrated ecological, social, and economic based approach to transportation planning that addresses existing and future road management options. This roads analysis reviews the current state of the forest roads system on the Angelina National Forest and focuses on the State, County, and Forest Service roads that are maintained for public use with low clearance passenger cars. Resource issues, budget concerns, and other local management problems were addressed in this analysis to make recommendations and identify opportunities to manage, maintain, and improve the forest roads system.
