

Caddo - LBJ National Grasslands Roads Analysis Report Introduction

The Caddo-Lyndon B. Johnson (LBJ) National Grasslands are composed of two separate National Grasslands located in north Texas near the Dallas-Fort Worth metropolitan area. The LBJ National Grasslands in Wise and Montague Counties are urban grasslands located about 50 miles northwest of Fort Worth, TX. The Caddo National Grasslands in Fannin County are located about 90 miles northeast of Dallas, TX. There are approximately 184,099 acres inside the proclaimed boundaries of which only 38,186 acres (21 percent) is National Grasslands. The National Grasslands within the proclaimed boundaries are intermingled with private lands which include ranches, residential areas, and communities.

Abstract: Roads analysis is an integrated interdisciplinary approach to transportation planning that addresses existing and future road management options. This roads analysis reviews the current state of the road system serving the Caddo-LBJ National Grasslands and focuses on the State, County, and Forest Service roads that are maintained for public use. Resource issues, budget concerns, and other local road management problems were addressed in this analysis to make recommendations and identify opportunities to manage, maintain, and improve the grasslands roads system.
