**YOUR INPUT IS REQUESTED IN HELPING THE TILLER RANGER DISTRICT
NAME STREAMS!**

The Tiller Ranger District is working with the public to officially proposed stream names to the U.S. Board on Geographic Names for 16 small, unnamed streams in the Jackson Creek, Boulder Creek, and Fish Lake drainages. The purpose of this effort is to name fish-bearing, unnamed streams for administrative tracking purposes. While this action is administrative in nature and exempt from NEPA, public input into the naming of these streams is being sought. The public is encouraged to submit ideas for stream names or provide information on the historical names of these streams.

The location of these streams are throughout T28S R1W and R1E; T 29S R3E; T30S R1W, R1E, R2E and R3E. Your input is being requested via phone, mail or email though April, 2005. Please Note: The Office of General Council in the Department of Agriculture determined that the names and addresses of persons who respond to solicitations for comments for Forest Service projects are subject to the Freedom of Information Act and subject to public review. Comments received in response to the actions in this publication, including names and addresses of those who comment, will be considered part of the public record on the proposed action and will be available for public inspection. Comments received anonymously will be accepted and considered; however, those who submit anonymous comments will not have standing to appeal the subsequent decision under 36 CFR part 215. Additionally, pursuant to 7 CFR 1.27(d), any person may request the agency to withhold a submission from the public record by showing how the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) permits such confidentiality. Persons requesting such confidentiality should be aware that, under FOIA, confidentiality may be granted only in very limited circumstances, such as to protect trade secrets. The Forest Service will inform the requester of the agency's decision regarding the request for confidentiality, and where the request is denied, the agency will return the submission and notify the requester that the comments may be resubmitted with or without name and address within 15 days.
