

FIRE AREA CLOSURE

MT. HOOD NATIONAL FOREST

ORDER

Pursuant to 36 CFR, 261.50(a) and (b) the following acts are prohibited in the area and on the roads and trails depicted and generally described in Attachment A of this order on the Mt. Hood National Forest.

1. Going into or being upon an area 36 CFR 261.52(e)
2. Being on a road 36 CFR 261.54(e)
3. Being on a trail 36 CFR 261.55 (a)

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50 (E) the following persons are exempt from these prohibitions.

1. Persons with a permit specifically authorizing the prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

This Forest Order is in effect until 10/15/2011 or until rescinded.

Violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. (16 U.S.C. 551 and 18 U.S.C. 3559 and 3571).

Attachment A – Description

MH-2011-15

Forest Roads 1811, 1650, 1660, 2840 south of Kinnickinnick Campground, 3511, and 3512012 and all their associated spur roads and all other National Forest System Roads as depicted on the attached map.

The following major trails are closed:

- Trail #600 from the Eliot Branch crossing near Cloud Cap northwest to its terminus at McNeil Point Trail #627;
- Mazamas Trail #625, Vista Ridge Trail #626, Elk Cove Trail #631, and Pinnacle Ridge Trail #630;
- All minor trails within the closure area depicted on the attached map.
