

ORDER NO. 10-11-03
RUTH FIRE AREA CLOSURE
SIX RIVERS NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety, the following acts are prohibited within the Six Rivers National Forest. This Order is effective from 6:00 p.m. on September 28, 2011, until the Ruth Fire is fully suppressed.

1. Going into or being upon National Forest System land within the Ruth Fire Closure Area. The Ruth Fire Closure Area boundary begins at the intersection of Forest Road No. 1S23 and the Ruth Hayfork Trail (Trail No. 8E01) located in the NE ¼ of the SW ¼ of Section 6, Township 2 South, Range 8 East, Humboldt Base and Meridien, then continues southeast along Forest Road No. 1S23 (Southfork Mountain Rd.) to its intersection with Forest Road No. 29N30 (Route 30), then continues southwest along Forest Road No. 29N30 to its intersection with County Road No. 501, then continues northwest along County Road No. 501 to its intersection with Forest Road No. 2S50, and then continues northeast along Forest Road No. 2S50 to its intersection with Forest Trail No. 8E01, then continues along Forest Trail No. 8E01 back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.52(e).
2. Being on any National Forest System road within the Ruth Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.54(e).
3. Being on Forest Road No. 1S23, from its intersection with Forest Road No. 1S04, then continuing southeast to its intersection with Forest Trail No. 8E01 (Ruth Hayfork Trail), as shown on the attached map.
4. Being on any National Forest System trail within the Ruth Fire Closure Area, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than 6 months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
