

# Superior National Forest – Fall Cone Collection Season 2011

## Changes from previous collection period:

- Jack pine cones (brown and gray) are now one price
- Black spruce cones being accepted
- 1 bushel minimum
- Maps of specific locations to collect cones will not be given out.

The Superior National Forest is accepting cones for purchase **beginning October 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2011 and ending December 20, 2011**. Species that will be purchased are jack pine at \$60 per bushel and black spruce at \$120 per bushel.

The Superior National Forest is in need of 100 bushels of black spruce cones and a minimum of 250 bushels of jack pine cones.

## JACK PINE

Jack pine cones may be brown or gray in color. Collect only closed cones by cutting or pulling them from branches. Jack pine cones may also be collected from squirrel caches or from recent logging slash. Store cones in a cool shady location to avoid having them open before delivery. Open cones will not be purchased. Cones with lichen or moss also will not be purchased.

## BLACK SPRUCE

Black spruce cones will be blue-black or purple in color. Cones can be collected by handpicking from standing or down trees or from squirrel caches. Cones are best collected from logging slash. Open cones will not be accepted and collections should be stored in cool shady location to avoid having cones open.

## Unacceptable open cones:



In general cones should be free of twigs, branches, needles, etc. Excessive amounts of twigs, branches and needles will require estimates of reduced volumes of cones and lead to reduced payment. Cone should not have insect bore holes. Cones should be stored in a cool, dry location and should be delivered as soon as possible to prevent the cones from opening or developing mold.


## REMEMBER:

- You will need to identify the location where you have collected the cones.
- Keep cones from separate locations in separate bags.

## Where to Collect?

Collection should only occur within the seed zones 1A and 2A (see insert) which are inside Cook, Lake, St. Louis and Itasca counties.



Cone collection can occur on Superior National Forest lands without a permit. Due to the Pagami Creek Fire, some portions of the Superior National Forest are closed to the public. Do not collect in the fire area as it will interfere with fire fighting operations and is not safe. Check website for current closure map and information

On other Federal lands including Chippewa National Forest permits may be required. On all other lands including state, county and private lands make sure to ask for permission or check with the proper representatives to obtain permits for those lands. It is acceptable to collect on your own property as long you are not within city limits.

**NOTE: Collecting cones by cutting down trees or pruning branching is illegal on the Superior National Forest.**

Collectors may only earn up to \$2500. You need to be registered through Central Contracting Registration (CCR) in order to collect cones and to receive payment. In order to register in CCR you must first have a DUNS number which can be obtained at the following website;

Registration is good for up to 12 months. You must renew and revalidate your registration at least every 12 months from the date you previously registered. However, you are strongly urged to revalidate your registration more frequently to ensure that CCR is up to date and in sync with changes that may have been made to DUNS, banking and IRS information. If you do not renew your registration, it will expire.
