

## **Smith Peak Stewardship Project**

**(REVISED)**

The Six Rivers National Forest is soliciting competitive offers for the Smith Peak Stewardship Project. Smith Peak Stewardship Project is located with T.2S., and T.3S., HBD&M. Sealed “Best Value” offers will be received at the Forest Supervisor’s Office at 10:00 a.m. local time on Wednesday, November 9, 2011, for an estimated 39,645 Tons (5,162 MBF) of sawtimber marked or otherwise designed for cutting on 1009.4 acres, one Mandatory stewardship project, and one Optional stewardship project. The Mandatory stewardship project is construction approximately 40 acres of fuel corridor within the commercial harvest units. The Optional stewardship project is construction of approximately 6 acres of fuel corridor. The Forest Service will evaluate competitive offers submitted by offerors who present a price offer and technical proposal according to the information found under the section in the offer titled “Instructions to Offerors.” Evaluation factors for this project are technical approach, capability and past performance, utilization of local workforce, and price. One award will be made to the offeror whose proposal is technically acceptable and who technical/price relationship is the “best value” to the Government. The Forest Service reserves the right to reject any and all offers. A prospectus, information concerning the timber and stewardship projects specific to this project, and submission of offers is available to the public and interested offerors from the Forest Supervisor, 1330 Bayshore Way, Eureka, CA 95501, or the District Ranger, Mad River Ranger District, 741 State Hwy 36, Bridgeville, CA 95526.
