




History Comes Alive!

Washburn 8th grade students make history come alive as their research leads to imaginative, original performances, informative documentaries, and historical reenactments. This History Day demonstrates that students learn history when they do history.

Washburn 8th grade students teamed up to research local and regional history topics and develop an original presentation which could be theatrical, informative, or musical. Student teams were responsible to plan their presentations and be prepared to present their topic to other students, teachers, parents,

Washburn 4-5th grade students will attend the programs in the morning and Washburn 6-7th grade students in the afternoon.

The History Day program's goal is to promote the study of history by engaging students and teachers in the excitement of historical inquiry and creative presentation.
