**Lands 1 - Availability of electronic site acres.**

Public Land Orders were issued by the BLM for 4 electronic sites, based upon the DM/FONSI dated 1/31/2003. All these sites are designated in the 1986 FLMP.

**Lands 2 - The effect of management practices conducted on adjacent or intermingled non-National Forest lands on the goals and objectives in the Forest Plan.**

The Forest has continued to work with the Pueblo of Sandia to develop a mutually acceptable land exchange proposal.

The Forest completed the survey of 19 miles of the T'uf Shur Bien Preservation Trust Area in accordance with the 2003 Appropriations Act requirement.

2 reservations for right-of-way were terminated across private land at the request of the private parties.

**Lands 3 - Miles of right-of-way acquired.**

The Forest completed right-of-way acquisition as follows: 0.55 mile on Road 191D, securing 1 access corridor, and 5 road segments totaling 2.17 miles in the Abbe Springs area.

Bernalillo County secured one right-of-way to the Casa Loma recreation residence area, a length of 0.57 mile, securing access on 1 corridor.

**Lands 4 - Effect of goals, objectives and management of the Forest on adjacent intermingled and surrounding non-National Forest lands.**

The Forest has issued permits, easements and leases that facilitate economic health of the affected communities

The Abbe Springs road project engendered a lawsuit based upon adverse impact to a local ranch. The lawsuit was withdrawn.
