To the U.S. Forest Service:

Please accept this letter and the enclosed comments from 809 of our supporters as public comment on the George Washington National Forest Draft Plan.

The Chesapeake Climate Action Network (CCAN) is the first grassroots, non-profit organization dedicated exclusively to fighting global warming in Maryland, Virginia, and Washington, D.C. With 70,000 supporters, our mission is to build and mobilize a powerful grassroots movement in this unique region that surrounds our nation's capital to call for state, national and international policies that will put us on a path to climate stability.

We were very pleased to see that the George Washington National Forest Draft Plan includes a ban on horizontal drilling for natural gas, which effectively bans hydraulic fracturing, commonly known as "fracking." While we share concerns over the harmful impacts that fracking can have on local drinking water supplies, our primary concern with the practice is its huge impact on climate change.


In a study released in March 2011, scientists from Cornell University evaluated the greenhouse gas footprint of natural gas obtained through fracking. Their study revealed that natural gas recovered in this way contains 30-50% more methane than natural gas recovered through traditional methods. Scientists also reported that 3.6% to 7.9% of this methane escapes into the atmosphere during the drilling process and continues to leak over the lifetime of the well. Methane, a greenhouse gas, has a far greater impact on global warming than carbon dioxide. Because of this, researchers now believe that drilling in the Marcellus Shale is more detrimental to the planet than coal mining.

CCAN strongly supports the ban on horizontal drilling for natural gas in the Draft Plan for George Washington National Forest and is eager to see it in the final version of the plan.
