

Christmas is a time for sharing and caring and we are glad you are able to share the beauty of the National Forest while cutting your Christmas tree.




**The following are the terms and conditions associated with your Christmas tree permit:**

- Maximum size tree to be cut is 20 feet tall with no more than a 6-inch diameter base. Do not cut the top out of a larger tree.
- Leave a stump less than 12 inches in height and remove leftover branches on the stump to avoid re-sprouting.
- Select your tree at least 100 feet from stream banks.
- Christmas trees cannot be harvested in wilderness areas, active timber sales, developed recreation areas or tree plantations.
- Cedar trees cannot be cut.
- The permit is valid only on National Forest lands and does not authorize cutting on private, state or other federal lands.
- Validate your permit and attach the tag to the tree so it is visible during transportation.



**While cutting your Christmas tree on the Fremont-Winema National Forests please remember:**

- Clear branches and debris from road banks and ditches.
- Allow plenty of time for travel. Dress warmly and carry a forest map, snacks and water. Also make sure relatives or friends know your planned route, general area of travel and return time.
- High-clearance 4-wheel drive vehicles and traction devices are recommended when driving on mountain roads at this time of year. Forest Service roads are not maintained during the winter. Please keep in mind that some roads are designated snowmobile trails and are only open to travel by snowshoes, skis or snowmobiles. Additionally, we ask that you be considerate of the environment and tread lightly.
- Be aware that some parking areas on National Forest lands require a Sno-Park permit from the State of Oregon.
