

Cherry Hill Recreation Area



Nature's peace and quiet attract many to this 29-site campground. Visitors have access to flush toilets, warm showers, and a dump station (no hookups). Each season, many regulars who like to get away from the hustle and bustle of city life and from more developed campgrounds enjoy this area.

Surrounding area

Enjoy your afternoons visiting the nearby Chattooga River Picnic Area, Walhalla State Fish Hatchery or Ellicott Rock Wilderness Area. Hike part of the Foothills Trail or take a 30-minute drive northeast to Whitewater Falls, the highest waterfall in the east. Get your exercise by riding a paddle boat on a mountain lake found at Oconee State Park, a few minutes south of the campground. A small park store meets some camper's supply needs.

Directions: Follow Highway 28 north of the ranger station, taking the right fork (Highway 107). Cherry Hill is located nine miles north on the right.

Facilities:

- 29 sites
- Large spaces accommodate recreation vehicles
- Gravel tent pads
- Warm showers
- Dump station
- Flush toilets
- Drinking water

Fees and Reservations: Sites 1-3, 9-18, and 26-29 are available only by reservation. The fee is \$10 per site per night, plus a \$10 reservation fee. Reservations can be made immediately if the site is open. Online reservations can be made at www.reserveamerica.com. Reservations can also be made by calling 1-877-444-6777. The call center hours of operation are 11 AM to 1 AM EDT. The closest place to Cherry Hill to receive a good cell phone signal is one and one-half miles north on Highway 107, at the intersection of 107 and the Burrells Ford Road.

Sites 4-8 and 19-25 are available on a first come, first served basis. The fee for these sites is \$10 per site per night. Pay at the self-registration station with 30 minutes of arrival.



Safety: Be aware of natural dangers associated with the outdoors.
