NOTE:

The Mexican gray wolf, grizzly bear, jaguar, and brown pelican are species known or suspected to have occurred on the Forest historically. The grizzly and jaguar have been extirpated, and there are no plans for recovery on the Forest at this time. The Mexican gray wolf has been reintroduced to portions of Arizona and New Mexico, but the Forest is outside of the designated recovery area. The brown pelican is sighted very infrequently during migration as an accidental species. These species are not addressed at the project level.
