

Your Fees at Work in 2006

Repair, Maintenance & Facility Enhancement

- Replaced posts at Alder Creek, Cherry Hill and Soldier Meadows campgrounds
- Refurbished and repainted site posts at Almanor campground
- Sanded and repainted picnic tables at Almanor, Domingo Springs, Gurnsey, and Soldier Meadows campgrounds
- Replaced thirteen fire rings with new accessible fire rings at Almanor and Battle Creek campgrounds
- Rewired the amphitheater and graveled the trail at Almanor campground

- Installed barrier rocks and posts to prevent vehicles from leaving spurs at Domingo Springs campground
- Rebuilt and opened Potato Patch campground including installation of tables, fire rings, and tent pads
- Graded and compacted roads, spurs and surrounding areas at Rocky Knoll and Silver Bowl campgrounds
- Provided regularly scheduled maintenance at all campgrounds, including garbage removal, restroom cleaning, digging out of fire rings, minor painting and sign repair, and hazard tree removal

Visitor Services

- Provided uniform components and mileage reimbursement for campground volunteer hosts
- Provided routine special use permit administration

Habitat Restoration

- Placed "No Motorized Vehicle" signs for meadow protection along campsite boundary at Almanor campground

Law Enforcement

- Provided law enforcement patrols to ensure visitor and resource protection

Cost of Collection

- Funded salaries, uniforms and fleet expenses for temporary employees who conducted fee collections and compliance

Upcoming Fee Projects

- Continue routine maintenance and repair
- Continue replacing fire rings, tables, sign posts, signs, etc., based on health and safety priorities
- Replace all tables at Silver Bowl and Rocky Knoll campgrounds
- Replace roofs and repair water damage in two restrooms at Hat Creek campground
- Repair and replace picnic tables, grills, site number posts, bulletin boards and signs
