Recreation Program Fee Accomplishment Report 2010

Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Six Rivers National Forest:

- Installed five bear proof recycling bins and nine fire rings in several campgrounds across the forest.
- Installed 13 new accessible fire rings at Patrick Creek Campground.
- Built and installed two new bulletin boards at Big Flat and Panther Flat campgrounds.
- Expanded the day use area at Fish Lake Campground and added a picnic table and grill.
- Installed an accessible fire ring and two picnic tables and expanded the parking area of a day use area.

Special Feature

Pearch Creek Day Use Area and Campground is a visitor favorite. Located in a mature Douglas fir and hardwood forest, the gentle sound of the flowing creek can be heard from most sites. Recreation fees were used to replace the visitor information kiosk and to make improvements to the adjacent day use area.
