ACCIPITRIDAE	KITES, HAWKS and EAGLES: Diurnal birds of prey with hooked bills and strong talons. Males usually smaller than females.
Accipitrinae	Subfamily that includes eagles. These birds are bigger than buteos. Bills are almost as long as the head.
Accipters	Agile woodland hawks with long tails and short, rounded wings
Buteos	Hawks that soar high in the air. Usually have broad, banded tails and rounded wings. Females usually larger. Dark morphs common.

KITES, HAWKS and EAGLES:

Accipters	Agile woodland hawks with long tails and short, rounded wings
Buteos	Hawks that soar high in the air. Usually have broad, banded tails and rounded wings. Females usually larger. Dark morphs common.
