Andrew Learmouth, Carter Ave., Winnipeg, Canada. Employed by Featherstone Employment Office, Spokane, Aug. 5, 1910. Mother and father in Winnipeg, Canada. Has two brothers.

Died in tunnel with Pulaski's crew. Buried in cemetery at Wallace, Idaho. Partner of Wm. Learmonth. Slender build, dark hair, dark complexion. May be from Bay City, Mich. Wrote Mayor of Bay City, but received no reply.

Shipped Aug. 5th from Spokane, by Featherstone Employment Agency. Buried Aug. 30, Wallace, Idaho. Smooth shaven, weight 185 pounds, height 5 ft. 6 ½ inches, age about 26 years. Have been unable to get a clue as to this man's identity.

60. RICHARD WOODS.

Unidentified. An old prospector buried at Wallace in cemetery. Was with Pulaski's crew, but was caught by the fire and perished within a few hundred feet of the tunnel. Height 5 ft., 5 ½ inches. Weight 195 pounds. Light brown hair, sprinkled with gray. Sandy mustache. About 50 years old. We wrote C. C. Schwartz, Seattle, Washington, who was supposed to have known this man, but received no reply. Mr. Woods spent a great deal of his time in the Salmon River country of southern Idaho, prospecting.
