


OUTREACH NOTICE

To Be Considered and Apply

Go to: <http://avuedigitalservices.com> and log in. If you are a new user, you will have to complete the steps for new user before you can begin the application process. Once logged in, click on the red tab titled **Job Search** located across the top of the page. Next, in the gray tabs across the top of page, click on **Search by Filters**. Next page, in Announcement Number window, type the announcement number:

Next to this window, click **ADD**. On the upper right side of page, the above vacancy announcement number should have appeared with a checked box. Now click the small red box **Find Jobs** located right underneath this area. Next, in the center of the next page, you should see: **Forestry Aid**

Click on the red job title and after the page changes, go to the right side and click on **Apply with AVUE** to begin the application process. Next page, start the process by clicking on each of the categories listed in red text on the right side of page. You must complete all sections before submitting your application by clicking the last option: ***Send Application**. Remember to click **SAVE and CONTINUE** at the bottom of every page before advancing to the next section! When you reach the **APPLICANT INFORMATION** section, under Preferred Locations, you will be able to select 9 different duty locations across the U.S. by clicking on **SELECT LOCATIONS**. NOTE: **South Lake Tahoe** OR **Incline Village, NV** are the **only** duty locations for LTBMU. No other cities are used for temporary employment.

At the end of the application, click **CONTINUE AND SEND APPLICATION**. You must now 'Certify' your application by checking a small box. At the bottom of page, click **SAVE AND SUBMIT APPLICATION**.

About the Forest

The Lake Tahoe Basin Management Unit is organized and administered as a national forest, but without ranger districts. Located at 35 College Drive in South Lake Tahoe, California, the primary mission of the LTBMU is to restore and preserve the legendary clarity of Lake Tahoe (one of the world's deepest mountain lakes, at an average depth of more than 1,000 feet!), while providing year-round recreational opportunities on National Forest System lands for millions of visitors annually.

The LTBMU is located in the Sierra-Nevada Mountain Range, at 6,225 feet above sea level. The Lake Tahoe Basin is comfortable in the summer, with daytime temperatures averaging 80 degrees Fahrenheit and evenings turning cool and crisp. Afternoon thunderstorms are common in the summer, though their durations are usually on the order of only minutes to a few hours and do nothing to dampen the spirits of boaters, hikers, mountain-bikers, and picnickers. During the autumn, the brilliant yellow color of aspen leaves provides a wonderful contrast to the deep green color of the pines. Winters are cold, but below-zero temperatures at night are rare. Winter snowfall averages about 6-feet to 10-feet per year adjacent to the lake and over 30 feet per year on the spectacular mountain peaks that bound the Basin. Exceptional alpine and downhill skiing, snowboarding, telemarking and Nordic/cross-country skiing are enjoyed from November through April. The sun shines on the Basin more than 330 days every year.
