Meeting Outcomes:

- IPNF Forest Supervisor has outlined the intent of developing a 5 Year Action Plan
 - Desire and need to develop the work and financial plans for the IPNFs. This includes the forest vegetation plan. Right now have district 5-year plans and 2-3 years of project planning but have no corporate forest-wide strategy. She would like to develop a corporate forest-wide strategy.
 - Look at opportunities 3-8 years out
 - This is not a NEPA effort; it's an internal effort

- Mike Almas provided additional overview the intent:
 - ✓ Goal: Develop a process to create an integrated 5 year action plan that facilitates the successful integration of forest vegetation and fuels programs with social and local desires.

 - ✓ Objectives:
 - Completed by June 2012
 - Reduce planning costs
 - Improve NEPA efficiency
 - Set priorities and use forest employees' time effectively and efficiently
 - Rebuild "shelf stock" of available projects for implementation
 - Create an integrated 5 year schedule of work
 - Implement the goals and objectives of the Forest Plan

 - ✓ Five Potential Criteria for planning with some key Elements for each:
 - Resources (T&E, forest health, priority watersheds, water quality)
 - Social (community support, CWPP, municipal watersheds, partnerships, regulatory compliance)
 - Economic (infrastructure enhancement, existing funding, logging systems, proximity to market)
 - Program Delivery (e.g. non-WUI fuels, road decommissioning)

- Risk Criteria (e.g. complexity, litigation potential)
- ✓ Identify Landscape Areas for Future Projects—considerations
 - Insect and Disease
 - IRPS layers
 - Composition and structure layers
