

ORDER NO. 12-3
TEMPORARY CLOSURE
SAN BERNARDINO NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the San Bernardino National Forest. This Order is effective from March 6, 2012 through June 15, 2012.

1. Going into or being upon the Gray's Peak Closure Area. The boundary of the Gray's Peak Closure Area begins at the intersection of Gray's Peak Trail and Forest Road No. 2N70, then continues northeast along the stream drainage to the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest, then continues west, south, and east along the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest to the shoreline of Big Bear Lake, then continues south along the shoreline of Big Bear Lake to its intersection with Highway 38, then continues west along Highway 38 to the boundary of the San Bernardino National Forest, then continues north along unclassified route U8430 to its junction with Forest Road No. 2N70, then continues north along Forest Road 2N70 back to the starting point, as shown on Exhibits A and B. 36 CFR 261.53(a).
2. Being on Gray's Peak Trail from the trailhead, then north to its intersection with Forest Road No. 2N70, as shown on Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.55(a).


Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.
