

Recommended Season
SPRING SUMMER FALL WINTER



ACCESS: Tubal Cain Trail starts 22 miles south of Sequim on FS Road #2870. From Highway 101, turn west onto the Louella Road across from Sequim Bay State Park. Go one mile and turn left onto Palo Alto Road, which becomes FS Road #28 at the forest boundary. Continue on this road to FS Road #2880, turn right, go past Dungeness Forks Campground, and turn left on #2870. The trailhead is 12.5 miles on the right.

FACILITIES: Small parking area, no toilets. Very limited room for vehicles with horse trailers to turn around.



SETTING: Conifer forest to mine. Remnants of historic Tubal Cain copper and manganese mine are visible. Panoramic alpine views of Copper Creek and Dungeness drainages from Buckhorn Pass.

TRAIL INFORMATION: 8.6 miles in length, grade is 8% to mine and 10 to 15% to Buckhorn and Marmot Passes.

OPPORTUNITIES: Hiking, horseback riding, viewing scenery and mountain climbing. Use existing campsites when possible. Treat all drinking water. Pack it out. Practice LEAVE NO TRACE techniques during your trip.

CLOSURES: Motorized vehicles and mountain bikes are prohibited.

TOPO MAPS: Buckhorn Wilderness Custom Correct Map or Tyler Peak USGS Quad.
