



Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use, and value.

Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest:

- Operated and maintained four campgrounds on the Ely Ranger District.
- Provided operations and maintenance support for Lye Creek Campground on the Santa Rosa Ranger District.
- Completed cleaning and maintenance tasks at Bob Scott Campground; supplemented funds to remove hazard trees and refinish picnic tables at developed sites across Austin/Tonopah Ranger District.
- Supported volunteer campground hosts, and funded operations and maintenance for two campgrounds on the Mountain City Ranger District.
- Improved processing and administration of the outfitter and guide special use program by funding wilderness and backcountry rangers to complete field camp inspections and make additional contact with permit holders.
