### Accomplishments Provided with Recreation Fees on the Sawtooth National Forest:

#### Minidoka Ranger District:

- Maintained 25 campgrounds, trailheads, and picnic areas across the district; pumped toilets, constructed fences, and completed improvement and maintenance projects.
- Supported a full-time host at the Porcupine Springs Campground who provided visitors with information and assistance.
- Developed and printed a new South Hills Trail brochure.
- Funded additional district office staff to provide improved visitor information services.
- Provided garbage service at dispersed sites in Rock Creek area.
- Partnered with Cassia County to plow parking lots and maintain winter access for snowmobile use.

#### Ketchum Ranger District:

- Supported a campground host who provided visitor services at Boundary Campground.
- Processed and administered several large recreation events: Trail Creek 12K Run, USA Cycling National Cross-Country Mountain Bike Championships, Expedition Inspiration, and partnered with the Elephant's Perch on a fun run/Baldy climb event.
- Funded additional trail crew personnel and completed maintenance on more trail miles than in a typical year.

With four mountain ranges, 300 lakes, and 250 miles of trail, visitors to the Sawtooth National Recreation Area (SNRA) are sure to find the perfect trail through this magnificent landscape no matter what their means of travel. In 2011, recreation fee funds were used to improve trails across the forest including 57 miles of popular trails within SNRA.


## Sawtooth National Forest Additional Accomplishments

### Sawtooth National Recreation Area:

- Maintained 57 miles of heavily used motorized and non-motorized trails.
- Provided river patrol, aquatic invasive species inspection, and education, and maintained and cleaned facilities along 34 miles of the Upper Salmon River.
- Provided security patrols, and cleaned and maintained sites in dispersed recreation areas.

### Fairfield Ranger District:

- Increased the frequency of regular maintenance and cleaning at 11 campgrounds.
- Repaired and replaced site features such as tables, kiosks, buildings, and signs at multiple campgrounds on the Fairfield Ranger District.
- Supported full-time campground hosts at Baumgartner and Chaparral campgrounds.


