# Accomplishment Report

## Recreation Fee Program



*Recreation fees are an investment in outdoor recreation. Current and future generations will benefit as 95% of the funds are reinvested in the facilities and services that visitors enjoy, use and value.*

### Accomplishments provided with recreation fees on the Boise National Forest:

- Leveraged grant funds from Idaho Parks and Recreation and regional sources to complete campsite upgrades at Rainbow, Amanita, and French Creek campgrounds. Improvements included installation of new accessible picnic tables, fire rings and information boards; upgrades to tent pads, water systems and campground roads; and placement of bear proof dumpsters. Partnered with the Southern Idaho Correctional Institution who provided the labor to complete the upgrades.
- Supplemented funds for South Fork Campground improvements: constructed a new restroom and information boards; refurbished a hand pump; installed bear proof dumpsters, accessible picnic tables and fire rings; and improved road and campsite definition.
- Sanded and painted tables at Greyback, Hayfork, Black Rock, Ten Mile, and Bonneville campgrounds and installed stairway at Hayfork Campground.
- Repaired and painted parking barriers at Power Plant and Greyback campgrounds.
- Purchased and installed a vault toilet at Riverside Campground.
- Installed 25 new accessible fire rings at campgrounds on the Lowman Ranger District.

### Special Feature

Surrounded by towering pines along the South Fork Payette River, Warm Springs Guard Station is an incredible place for a getaway. In 2010, fee funds were used to make historically accurate improvements to the cabin's cabinets and restore the fir flooring. The repaired hand pumps now provide a year-round supply of water and all new beds provide plenty of comfortable sleeping arrangements.

## Boise National Forest

### Additional Accomplishments

- Completed installation and painting of furnishings at Pine, Curlew, Dog Creek, and Elks Flat recreation sites.
- Continued debris removal from Curlew and Pine boat launches.
- Retrofitted 11 picnic tables to make them accessible; repaired and replaced bench seats as needed.
- Fabricated and painted campground information boards.
- Replaced the hand pump and repaired the fence at Dutch Creek Guard Station.
- Installed new flooring at Johnson Creek Cabin.
- Funded seasonal recreation crews to patrol recreation sites and complete compliance checks, contact visitors, coordinate volunteer groups, and complete water sampling and general maintenance tasks.
- Supported volunteer campground hosts who provided visitor information and compliance checks, and completed maintenance tasks.
- Funded additional staff for weekend operations, and the extended length of season for campground hosts.
- Supported a river ranger, who provided visitor information and patrols to increase public safety and educate boaters.
- Processed, administered, and monitored recreation events and outfitter and guides special use permits.


