

## Recreation Management Direction by Alternative

**Tables C-3a and C-3b** describes the management direction by alternative for each of the ROS setting indicators (Access, Remoteness, Naturalness/Visual Quality, Social Encounters, Visitor Management, Visitor Impact, and Facilities) by alternative. Management direction is described by RAAs in the Hells Canyon Wilderness first followed by RAAs in the nonwilderness portion of the HCNRA. Refer to **Chapter 3**, Recreation, Experiences, and Opportunities for a map of ROA and the RAAs. The management direction for each of the setting indicators is specified in terms of objectives, standards and guidelines to meet the overall recreation management direction proposed in **Appendix C, Table C-1**. Refer to **Tables C-2a through C-2f** for complete description of definitions related to the setting indicators.

**Tables C-3c and C-3d** identifies actions that would likely be implemented by alternative in the future to accomplish the management objectives identified in **Tables C-3a and C-3b** to support the goals for the HCNRA. Site-specific NEPA analysis would occur prior to implementation of these activities.

Refer to **Table C-6** for a comparison of development levels and maintenance levels by alternative for each of the recreation and administrative facilities by RAA. Table C-6 specifies the fire suppression priority for each of the facilities.

Refer to **Chapter 1** and the **Glossary** for further clarification of goals, objectives, standards, guidelines, and likely future proposals. A detailed description of the existing condition of each RAA is located in **Appendix D, Tables D-1 and D-2**.
