Open Daily: 8:00am to 5:00pm - Open Easter Sunday (4/8)

ROADS: Major Eastern Sierra roads are open, including HWY 395. Trans Sierra roads - SR 120 (Tioga Pass), SR 108 (Sonora Pass) and SR 4 (Ebbets Pass) are closed for the winter. SR 89 (Monitor Pass) is closed for the winter. June Lake Loop (SR 158) and Mono Mills (SR 120) roads are open. Weather and road conditions can change rapidly this time of year; mountain passes are subject to immediate controls and/or closures. Drivers headed to the mountains need to be sure their vehicles are equipped with chains, including those with snowtires. SR 270, the **BODIE STATE HISTORIC PARK** road is open. The Rock Creek road is open to the East Fork parking area. In Bishop Creek, SR 168 is open to Aspendell and the South Lake road is open to Bishop Creek Lodge. In the White Mountains, the road to the **ANCIENT BRISTLECONE PINE FOREST AND SCHULMAN GROVE** is open to the Sierra View Gate. The Big Pine (Canyon) road is open.

Major highways through **DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL PARK** are open. The Big Pine, Titus Canyon, Salt Creek, Devils Golf Course, West Side and Charcoal Kilns dirt roads are open. The North Saline Valley road is open; 4x4 high clearance recommended (carry chains). The South Pass into Saline Valley is posted closed by Inyo County (4x4 high clearance vehicles required/travel at your own risk). Rangers ask visitors traveling to remote locations to leave a complete itinerary at home, obtain a good backcountry road map and be prepared for the unexpected. Drivers need to be sure their vehicle is in good condition and to carry an additional spare tire, extra gas, food and water. WEATHER: A storm system will move over Northern California into Central Nevada midweek, producing cooler temperatures, gusty winds with a slight chance of snow showers in Mono County on Thursday. Friday winds will diminish and temperatures remain below normal. High pressure will build over the Eastern Sierra and Northern Mojave over the weekend, warming temperatures to above normal by early next week. Highs have been in the 20s in the mountains, upper 60s in the Owens Valley and lower 90s in Death Valley, with the lows ranging from low teens in the mountains, to the upper 50s in Death Valley.

CAMPGROUNDS: **INYO COUNTY** campgrounds are open. The **BUREAU OF LAND MANAGEMENT** campgrounds at Tuttle Creek (fee/no water) and the Pleasant Valley Pit (fee/no water) are open. Additional privately operated campgrounds & RV facilities are open throughout the area.

INYO NATIONAL FOREST, Lone Pine to Lee Vining - the following campgrounds are open: Lone Pine (water/fee), Upper & Lower Grays Meadow (no water/reduced fee), Bitterbrush (no water/no fee) and Holiday in Rock Creek (no water/no fee).

YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK - Yosemite Valley campgrounds have sites open and reservable. Reservations are accepted five months in advance on the 15th of each month, for a one-month block through www.recreation.gov; or call 1-877-444-6777. Sites are available on a first-come, first-served basis at Wawona (SR 41 south of Yosemite Valley), Hodgdon Meadows (SR 120, near Big Oak Flat) and Camp Four walk-in campground in Yosemite Valley. For information, visit the web site at www.nps.gov/yose.

DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL PARK, open sites include: Sunset, Texas Spring, Stovepipe Wells, Mesquite Springs, Emigrant (tent only/no fee) and Wildrose (no fee). Furnace Creek campground is closed for sewer and water line replacement, estimated opening in May; other campgrounds are available in the area. RV hook-ups are available at Furnace Creek Ranch, Stovepipe Wells Village and Panamint Springs Resort. For more information, visit www.nps.gov/deva.

RED ROCK CANYON STATE PARK, on SR 14 south of Ridgecrest, offers great desert camping.

Camping sites are available year round in the **MOJAVE NATIONAL PRESERVE** at Hole-In-The-Wall and Mid Hills on a first-come/first-served basis. For more information, call 1-760-252-6108, or visit the web at www.nps.gov/moja. Black Canyon Equestrian & Group Campground (across from Hole-In-The-Wall) is open with reservations required, call 1-760-928-2572.

FISHING: The **OWENS RIVER** south of Crowley Lake (including Pleasant Valley Reservoir and Tinnemaha Reservoir) and **DIAZ LAKE** are open to year-round fishing. Fishing is open in southwest Inyo County (Independence Creek south to the county line, with US 395 on the east and the Sierra Crest to the west). The 2012 Eastern Sierra Fishing Guide is now available throughout the region. California fishing regulations are available at sporting goods stores selling fishing licenses, the Visitor Center or on the web at www.dfg.ca.gov.

WINTER SPORTS: **MAMMOTH MOUNTAIN** is open with a 6 to 8 foot base. For daily lift operation and snow conditions visit the web site at www.mammothmountain.com, or call 1-888-766-9778. **JUNE MOUNTAIN** is open with a 2 to 4 foot base, check the web at www.junemountain.com, or call 1-760-934-2224 for more information.

TAMARACK CROSS COUNTRY SKI CENTER in the Mammoth Lakes Basin is open with 16 miles of set track; for information call 1-760-934-2442. Visit the **MAMMOTH LAKES WELCOME CENTER** for current snow conditions, trail maps and avalanche risk; open daily 8:00am to 5:00pm, or call 1-760-924-5500. The **EASTERN SIERRA AVALANCHE CENTER (ESAC)** offers avalanche advisories and an on-line discussion center for the region. For information, check the web at www.esavalanche.org.

BACKCOUNTRY: Backpackers should be prepared with winter gear for snowy/icy terrain, freezing temperatures and sudden weather changes. The roads to most trailheads are closed for the winter. **WILDERNESS PERMITS** are required for overnight travel all year long. Trailhead quotas, which daily limit the number of hikers on trails, are no longer in effect for Eastern Sierra wilderness areas. Self-issue permits can be obtained in the night boxes at the following locations: Eastern Sierra InterAgency Visitor Center (Lone Pine), White Mountain Ranger Station (Bishop), Mammoth Lakes Welcome Center, Mono Basin Scenic Area Visitor Center (Lee Vining) and Bridgeport Ranger Station after office hours. ONGOING ACTIVITIES:

BODIE STATE HISTORIC PARK is open daily 9:00am to 3:00pm. Bring drinking water, food and plenty of warm clothes for a winter visit to Bodie (recreation fee area-open 4/8).

The **MONO BASIN NATIONAL FOREST SCENIC AREA/TUFA STATE RESERVE** Visitor Center, located 1 mile north of Lee Vining on HWY 395, is open 9:00am to 4:30pm, Thursday - Monday (open 4/8) for displays, information and a film presentation. Photographers and geology enthusiasts alike will find the beauty of this million-year old lake a fascinating destination with its captivating vistas, dramatic snow-covered peaks and intriguing volcanic formations.

Visit the Mono Lake Committee & Lee Vining Chamber of Commerce Information Center, located in the center of town, open daily 9:00am to 5:00pm (open 4/8) for lots of information on the **MONO BASIN NATIONAL FOREST SCENIC AREA/MONO LAKE TUFA STATE RESERVE**.

Remember the days of the "Slim Princess"! Visit **LAWS RAILROAD MUSEUM & HISTORIC SITE**, four miles north of Bishop on HWY 6, to learn of early days in the Owens Valley. Laws is open daily 10:00am to 4:00pm (closed 4/8).

EASTERN CALIFORNIA MUSEUM in Independence is open from 10:00am to 5:00pm daily, with exhibits on Inyo County; including a significant collection of Native American baskets and artifacts from Manzanar NHS (closed 4/8).

The Interpretive Center at **MANZANAR NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE**, located 5 miles south of Independence, is open daily from 9:00am to 4:30pm. Check at the Interpretive Center, or the web at www.nps.gov/manz for more information (open 4/8).

Visit the Beverly & Jim Rogers **MUSEUM OF LONE PINE FILM HISTORY**; with exhibits celebrating the heroes, the films and the locations of the many movies shot in the area. The museum opens daily at 10:00am; closing at 6:00pm Monday through Wednesday, at 7:00pm Thursday through Saturday and at 4:00pm on Sunday (open 4/8).

Discover the natural and cultural history of the **MOJAVE DESERT** at the **MATURANGO MUSEUM AND NORTHERN MOJAVE VISITOR CENTER OF THE INDIAN WELLS VALLEY** in Ridgecrest; open daily 10:00am to 5:00pm (closed 4/8).

BLM JAWBONE STATION REGIONAL OHV FACILITY is open 9:00am to 5:00pm daily for trip assistance. The station is located 20 miles north of Mojave on SR 14 for pre-trip information; call 1-760-373-1146 (open 4/8).

DEATH VALLEY NATIONAL PARK VISITOR CENTER at Furnace Creek is open daily, 8:00am to 5:00pm (open 4/8). Ranger talks and interpretive programs are presented daily. An evening program is presented at 7:30pm in locations near Furnace Creek. Check at the Visitor Center or on the web at www.nps.gov/deva for more information. **SCOTTY'S CASTLE** has "Living History" tours from 9:00am to 5:00pm (open 4/8), and "Underground Mystery Tours" daily. Reservations for Scotty's Castle are available on the web at recreation.gov, or call 1-877-444-6777.

Information on the **MOJAVE NATIONAL PRESERVE** can be obtained daily from 9:00am to 5:00pm (open 4/8) at the **Kelso Depot Visitor Center** (off I 15 at Baker or off I 40 on Kelbaker Road). The Visitor Center features exhibits, an orientation film, an art gallery and bookstore. Kelso Depot ranger talks are offered daily at 11:00am and 2:00pm. The Kelso Dunes interpretive walk is offered on Saturdays at 11:00am. The **Hole-in-the-Wall Information Center** is open Wednesday through Sunday, from 9:00am to 4:00pm (open 4/8), with interpretive activities on the weekends.

Reports on current recreation conditions, schedules of planned events and detailed information on visitor destinations throughout the Eastern Sierra Nevada and Northern Mojave Desert are available daily (open 4/8) at the Visitor Center. 4/4/12kcw
