#### **Informational Updates:**

- Anderson Cove Campground will be open for the winter season. Sites are listed as first come, first served. Please contact the Utah Recreation Company at 385-273-1100 for more information.
- Interagency Passes and Forest Service Maps are available at our district office. Please see the table below or call 385-405-7100 for more information.
- Anderson Cove boat ramp is still open for boat launching. All other boat ramps have closed for the season.
- Anderson Cove Day Use, Cemetery Point, and Middle Inlet are closed. Beach access is still available at other locations such as Pelican Beach, Spring Creek, and Windsurfer.
- Hunting season will begin October 7<sup>th</sup>. Please contact the Division of Wildlife Resources for more information.

## **Interagency Passes**

The Utah Recreation Company (URC) manages the onsite camping, boat launching, storage and rental stations for the area. You may reach them at 385-273-1100. Cemetery Point, Anderson Cove, and Port Ramp Marina boat launch facilities are also managed by URC - all seasonal and weekly passes can be purchased from them directly. ## **Causey Reservoir**

Causey Reservoir is located 15 miles northeast of Ogden, just off SR-39. There are many recreational opportunities to enjoy, such as: fishing, camping (limitations), hiking, and swimming. The following are some important guidelines to remember when visiting Causey:

- You must camp at least 200 feet from streams, lakes, rivers, and other bodies of water, and 300 feet from roads, trails, and other developed areas. Refer to Motor Vehicle Map for dispersed camping areas around Causey.
- No motorized boats are allowed in the reservoir. Kayaks, canoes, and paddleboards are approved.
- It is REQUIRED to wear a Coast Guard-approved lifejacket while in the water, unless supervised by a certified lifeguard.
- Possessing a beverage that is defined as an alcoholic beverage by Utah State Law is prohibited, except in designated overnight camping areas.
- Please follow all fire restrictions that apply during your stay. Current restrictions can be found at www.utahfireinfo.gov.
- Please follow all parking rules and regulations. Overnight parking is allowed if the parking signs are adhered to
- Dogs are welcomed at Causey. However, they must be on a leash at all times.

It is important to research an area before you head there. Check for things like weather, what type of wildlife you might encounter, whether it is hunting or mating season, what to do if you encounter wildlife, etc.

Forest roads and gates on the Ogden Ranger District (ORD) close in the fall for road surface protection. The Motor Vehicle Use Map (MVUM) shows the earliest date a road will open to motorized travel in the spring and the date a road will close in the fall. ## **Dispersed Camping**

Dispersed camping does not provide you with any type of services or facilities. It is just you and the woods. Dispersed camping is not as simple as driving up to the woods and pitching a tent. There's a handful of rules and regulations that go along with dispersed camping. Here are a few examples of dispersed camping rules:

- You must camp at least 200 feet from streams, lakes, rivers, and other bodies of water.
- You must camp at least 300 feet from developed roads and trails.
- You may not camp or leave any equipment at the same location for more than 14 consecutive days within a 30-day period.
- You may not camp near to established recreation areas (trailheads, maintained campgrounds, other developed areas, etc.)
- You may not camp in meadows or clearings (you're not wildlife, so stay out of sight!)

It is important to research an area before you head there. Check for things like burn bans, what type of wildlife you might encounter, whether it is hunting or mating season, what to do if you encounter wildlife, etc. Refer to Motor Vehicle Map for areas that allow dispersed camping.

**Pack it in, pack it out**, and practice the Leave No Trace principles (meaning make it look like you were never there and take all your trash with you). Make efforts to camp in locations that have been used before. This will help limit your impact on the environment.

#### **Firewood and Tree Permits**

Firewood season: June 26, 2023 – November 17, 2023

Firewood Permits for the Cache County and Weber County areas are now available. Permit to be used within authorized counties from the District Office that the permit was purchased from. Must purchase minimum of 4 cords for \$30. Maximum is 10 cords for \$75. Limits are based per household. Cutting area maps can be found at www.fs.usda.gov/main/uwcnf/passes-permits/forestproducts
