



**PUBLIC NOTICE-CUSTOMERS OF USFS Noblett Lake Recreation Area
FAILURE TO MEET MICROBIOLOGICAL MONITORING
REQUIREMENTS FOR DRINKING WATER**



Este informe contiene información sobre su agua potable. Tradúzcalo o hable con alguien que lo entienda bien.

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During September 2011 we did not adequately test for total coliform bacteria and therefore cannot be sure of the quality of our drinking water during that time.

This is a minor monitoring violation of the Missouri Public Drinking Water Regulations. The Missouri Department of Natural Resources requires that drinking water from this supply be tested for this type of bacteria by submitting at least one valid sample per month. Bacteriologically-contaminated water can cause a variety of disease symptoms. It is important that drinking water be routinely tested to ensure the safety of those who consume it.

Provide explanation of cause of monitoring failure and any recent results:

Violation - failure to collect enough valid routine samples; the water system had been shut down for 2011 season when notice dated 10/27/11 was received. On 4/3/12 a special sample was taken and results were good. Water sample taken on 4/11/12 was good.
