

ORDER NO. 11-12-02
PLUMAS NATIONAL FOREST
ROAD AND AREA CLOSURE

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to protect the bald eagle, the following acts are prohibited within the Plumas National Forest. This Order is effective from April 28, 2012 through July 15, 2012.

1. Going into or being upon the Bald Eagle Closure Area. The Bald Eagle Closure Area is located in Section 33, T22N, R9E, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian. The Closure Area boundary begins at the intersection of Forest Road No. 22N57YA and Forest Road No. 22N57Y; then continues due west to its intersection with the shoreline of Little Grass Valley Reservoir, then continues north along the shoreline for .93 miles, then continues due west back to the starting point, as shown on the attached map. 36 CFR 261.53(a).
2. Being on the National Forest System roads listed below and shown on the attached map:
 - a. Forest Road No. 22N57YA.
 - b. Forest Road No. 22N57YB.

36 CFR 261.54(e).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Any Federal, State or local officer or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.


These prohibitions are in addition to the prohibitions contained in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.

After having reviewed the project file and discussing with my staff, I have decided to implement the seasonal road and area closure order for the Little Grass Valley – Bald Eagle Territory area from April 28, 2012 through July 15, 2012.

The bald eagle is protected by the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act (Eagle Act, 1940 as amended in 1962). On June 5, 2007, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service clarified its regulations implementing the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act and published a set of National Bald Eagle Management Guidelines (May 2007). This law prohibits killing, selling or otherwise harming eagles, their nests or eggs.

The Little Grass Valley bald eagle active nest is within the northern loop of the Wyandotte campground. Disturbance of the eagles appears unavoidable if people enter this area and the scenic loop road which runs parallel to the campground. These two areas are within the distance buffer area as recommended in the Bald Eagle Guidelines. Activities in the closure area that are likely to disturb bald eagles include, but are not necessarily limited to, snowmobiling, camping, walking, picnicking, swimming and boat landing. I have therefore determined that this closure is necessary to ensure that bald eagles nesting at Little Grass Valley Reservoir are protected.

There is a signed Environmental Assessment (EA) supporting this action. Feather River Ranger District wildlife staff have reviewed the current status of bald eagles at Little Grass Valley Reservoir and determined that the circumstances are currently the same as was addressed in the EA. Feather River District's Public Services department has also reviewed this recommendation. The project file, which contains the Civil Rights Impact Assessment, the District Ranger recommendation letter, a map and the Environmental Assessment is located at the Feather River Ranger District office.

This is not a project or activity implementing the Plumas National Forest Land and Resource Management Plan that is documented in a Decision Memo, Decision Notice, or Record of Decision. This proposed closure meets the criteria found in Forest Service Handbook 1909.15, Section 31.1: categories for which a project or case file and decision memo are not required. Activities which include routine administrative, maintenance and other actions are categorically excluded from documentation in an environmental impact statement or environmental assessment. These activities do not individually or cumulatively have a significant effect on the



quality of the human environment. This proposed closure applies Category 1 (established by the Chief): Orders issued pursuant to 36 CFR Part 261 - Prohibitions to provide short-term resource protection or to protect public health and safety. There are no extraordinary circumstances related to the proposed action that would warrant further analysis and documentation in an EA or EIS (FSH 1909.15 subsection 30.3(2)).

The campground within the northern loop and the parallel scenic loop road will be closed to ensure Bald and Golden Eagle protection.
