ARCHERY RANGE CAMPING CLOSURE

A. PROHIBITIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a), the following acts are prohibited in the area described in this order within the Spring Mountains National Recreation Area, Humboldt-Toiyabe National Forest until further notice.

1. Camping [36 CFR 261.58(e)]

B. EXEMPTIONS

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), each of the following is exempt from this order.

1. Persons with a Forest Service authorization specifically exempting them from the effect of this order.
2. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

C. AREA DESCRIBED

Within Archery Range (see map Attachment A). Archery Range is located off SR 158 near mile marker 7 where FDR 45078 begins. The legal location of the project area is Township 19S, Range 56E, Sections 6 and 7.

D. PURPOSE

The purpose of this order is to restrict people from dispersed camping within Archery Range. Dispersed campers in the area have cut down trees, created illegal roads, and left trash; causing erosion, soil compaction, and damage to natural resource habitat.

E. IMPLEMENTATION

1. This order will be in effect when signed and shall remain in effect until terminated.
2. Exhibit A, Map, is attached and incorporated into this ORDER.
3. Any violation of this order is punishable as a class B misdemeanor, by a fine of not more than \$5,000.00 for an individual or \$10,000.00 for an organization and/or imprisonment of not more than 6 months [16 USC 551, Title 18 USC 3571(b)(6), Title 18 USC 3581 (b)(7)].



Archery Range


