COST SHARE AGREEMENT for the CA-SQF-001356 Incident.

This cost share agreement between USFS and CAL FIRE and with the cooperation of Kern County Fire Department prepared under the following guidelines:

1. In accordance with the "California Master Cooperative Wildland Fire Management and Stafford Act Response Agreement" between the USDA, Forest Service, USDI, Bureau of Land Management, USDI, National Park Service, USDI Fish and Wildlife Service, USDI Bureau of Indian Affairs, and the California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CAL FIRE).
2. All costs originating from orders placed by and for the incident that can be reasonably obtained and estimated for the cost share period will be included in this agreement and will be shared on the basis of the Incident Commanders / Agency Representatives mutual agreement.
3. Costs for non-expendable property purchases by each agency will be charged direct to that agency and will not be shared.
4. Costs incurred by cooperators not engaged in joint fire suppression activities will not be included as a part of this cost share agreement.
5. Agency specific costs will not be shared.
6. Responsibility for tort claim costs or compensation for injury costs will not be a part of and will be determined outside of this agreement.
7. Suppression repair and Non-suppression rehabilitation costs are the responsibility of the jurisdictional agency and will not be shared.
8. Costs for non fire related repair of agency owned equipment is the responsibility of the owning agency. It is not a part of and will be determined outside of this agreement.
9. The USFS will be responsible for all operational costs associated with perimeter control within the Federal DPA with the exceptions identified in items 10-11.
 - a. Costs for all ground resources
 - b. Costs for all "Fixed" and "Rotary" wing aircraft
 - c. Costs for all Retardant
10. In consideration of suppression effort on State DPA, CAL FIRE will be responsible for (See Exhibit A):
 - a. all "Out of State" Strike Teams of Type 6 engines on the Incident.
 - b. all "Structure Protection" Strike Teams of Type 1 and Type 2 engines on the Incident.

11. CAL FIRE is responsible for the following costs as the "offset" for support costs incurred by the USFS (See Exhibit B):

- a. CAL FIRE will be responsible for the CAL FIRE Type 1 Handcrews.
- b. CAL FIRE will be responsible for OES Water Tender 62.


12. Within 10 months the parties to this agreement will meet to determine the total actual costs of each agency. The agency, whose total actual costs exceed their proportional share of the overall incident final costs, as determined within this agreement, will bill the other agency. The billing, when paid, will result in each agency sharing overall incident costs as herein agreed.

13. An administrative charge, the pre-established percentage set by each agency, will be applied by the agency issuing the settlement billing for the net amount owed.

This agreement and the apportionment are our best judgments of agency cost responsibilities.




