**Wilderness:** Rawah

**Difficulty Rating:** strenuous


**Beginning Elevation:** Trail #966 8,400 feet

**Use:** moderate, except fall hunting seasons

**Peak Elevation:** Trail #966 9,940 feet

**Quadrangle Maps:** Glendevey, Shipman Mountain, and Rawah Lakes

**One-way Length:** Trail #966 9.2 miles;  
Trail #974 6.9 miles



**Access:** Travel 11 miles northwest of Fort Collins on U.S. Highway 287 to Colorado Highway 14. Turn left on CO 14, and travel 52 miles to County Road 103, Laramie River Road. Turn right and travel north about 16 miles to County Road 80C, Glendevey Road. Turn left and travel about 3 miles to the Link and McIntyre trailhead parking on the left just past the Browns Park Campground and across the creek.

**Trail Information:** The McIntyre Trail promptly enters the Rawah Wilderness and begins with a mile-long traverse to McIntyre Creek before beginning a 4-mile ascent to an area known as Housmer Park and the beginning of the McIntyre Creek Trail. The McIntyre Trail continues about 5 miles northward to meet the Shipman Park Trail, which descends to the northeast corner of the wilderness and terminates on private land. McIntyre then ends where it meets the Medicine Bow Trail (#965) at Ute Pass on the Medicine Bow Divide. The Shipman Park Trail begins just before Ute Pass and descends in a northeast direction into Shipman Park, which is a large open valley.

### *General Wilderness Regulations*

- Dogs must be on a hand held leash
- No motorized or mechanized equipment
- Camps, campfires, and stock, where allowed, at least 200 feet from water and trails
- Group size limited to 12 people or stock animals
- Certified weed-free hay is required for stock

### *Alpine Closure*

- Fires are prohibited above 10,800' (tree line)
